ROLE PROFILE

Option 1: Manager in Children's Residential Care

These Managers play a leading role in developing the ethos of the home and create a sense of purpose and clarity for the long term care and support of children and young people in residential care.

Option 2: Children, Young People and Families Manager within the Community

These Managers will work in settings as diverse as family homes, youth centres, early years, youth justice, children's centres, educational settings and the community. YEARS

Your apprentices will complete a 24 month apprenticeship learning journey. Their journey will include achievement of either Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Residential Childcare or Level 5 Diploma in Leadership for Health and Social Care. A minimum of Level 2 English and Maths is required prior to taking the End-Point Assessment.

On completion of their learning journey, apprentices will undertake an End-Point Assessment, with an independent iCQ assessor.

Throughout their journey, your apprentices will record and update their progress using iCQ's **iLearner** system, and their End-Point Assessment will be delivered using **iLearner**.

SITUATIONAL JUDGEMENT TEST

A 45-minute, paper-based, written test consisting of 4 questions, to test the thinking and approach of the apprentice in dealing with specific situations that are typical of the of management and leadership of work within the children, young people and families sector.

COMPETENCE INTERVIEW

A 55 to 65-minute structured discussion between your apprentices and an iCQ assessor. Questions and discussion topics will focus on the work the apprentice has undertaken, the strengths demonstrated and will consider any gaps or weaknesses in knowledge, skills or behaviours.
